International School Award

Mapping the Blue

A brainstorming session on Underwater Tourism was conducted for Grades VII and VIII students by Ms. Mathangi. This was followed by a Talk given by an expert on Marine Pollution and job opportunities in Oceanography, Dr. K.V Thomas, Academic Consultant, Kerala University of Fisheries and Ocean studies, Kochi. As part of World Ocean Day celebrations, students attended a workshop and a brochure making competition related to Marine resources. Through these activities students were able to explore the world of oceans.

A competition on brochure making was held on 22 June 2016, for the students of Grades VII and VIII. Students collected information and pictures on marine resources of India, Australia, Maldives, Japan and a few of other countries prior to the competition. The event helped students to gain more knowledge on marine resources.

On 4 July 2016, the students of Grade VII were given an activity to create charts on different kinds of oceans in the world, fish harvesting etc. They were allowed to use information and pictures collected from books, internet etc. The topics included were a comparative study of the three main oceans, differences in the harvesting of fish, the quality of water in oceans and how it varies from one ocean to another, usage of marine resources in different parts of the world etc.

A Display of Charts on a comparative study of Physiochemical features of different oceans, prepared by the students of Grade VII was organized on 08 July 2016. Salinity and fish harvesting were the focus points of comparison. Students were able to understand the role of physiochemical properties in the behaviour of oceans.

Students of Grade VIII submitted PowerPoint presentations on the physical properties of oceans, on 11 July 2016. The topics included were salinity, temperature, density of oceans etc.

On 3 August 2016, students from Grade VIII were taken on a field trip to Vizhinjam International Seaport, Trivandrum, Kerala. The focus of the activity was to study the lifestyle and issues of the fishermen community. The students gave a questionnaire and collected information on myths about the sea, the roughness of the sea, kinds of fish available in the sea etc. This activity made the students understand the life of the fishermen community and also the issues they face in their life.

A team of academicians from St. Michel's College, Switzerland, visited CNIS to interact with CNItes, in connection with the Indo Swiss Classroom Project. Students who were a part of the project "Mapping the Blue" formally welcomed them to our alma mater. Mr. Matthias Wider, St. Michel's College Principal, inaugurated the assembly on the "Cultural aspects of Maldives", on 21 July 2016

Lean words in English



A Brainstorming session was conducted on 24 June 2016 and the students of Grade IX were introduced to the topic and were briefed on the activities planned.


