The ISA project, All the World's a Stage: Contemporary World Theatre, was officially inaugurated on 14 October 2016 by Mr. Prasanth Narayanan, renowned playwright, director and writer in the field of Indian Drama. The inauguration was

followed by a talk on the scenario of contemporary world theatre, wherein he enlightened the students on the techniques used by dramatists and also introduced them to Natyasasthra of Bharatha, the most authoritative Indian book on theatre.

The students got the opportunity to talk to Ms. Elisa Herrmann, a Cultural Science student from Germany who was on a visit to India. She spoke to the students

on the developments in Germany in the field of drama and also about how the new generation keeps away from theatre due to overindulgence in technology.

- An exhibition was conducted on a few chosen periods in world drama, as part of Iridescent 2016, the Annual Educational Fair of the school. Students came up with models, posters and charts depicting the various aspects of world drama.
- Students, in groups, prepared PowerPoint Presentations on different periods of drama. The groups led by CNItes Rejath R, Rahul R.B., Kevin Moses Biju, Fathimath Shaza and Ahmed Faruhaan brought the different aspects of drama such as costumes, setting etc. beautifully into the restricted space of a few slides. Two groups were chosen to present the same to the others.
- A brainstorming session was conducted on 8 December, for the students to get familiarized more with the diverse aspects of contemporary drama, and world drama as a whole, based on the information they gathered out of the various activities conducted as part of the project. A discussion followed the brainstorming wherein the students shared information on contemporary theatre with reference to countries of their choice; India, Germany, France, Australia, Japan and South Korea to name just a few.



# Humanité

With a view to enhance the social awareness of the CNItes, the Higher Secondary Section started a new venture, Humanité, a Community Service Initiative and a student centred program that focuses on giving first-hand experience of working for and helping the needy of the society. The program was kicked off on 19 November by distributing brochures to drivers at Wayanad, creating awareness on traffic rules and educating them to reduce honking in particular, during the School Trip of Grades X, XI & XII to Wayanad and Coorg. The traffic awareness campaign continued with the CNItes distributing brochures to the city dwellers of Trivandrum on 30 November.

A visit to Santa Maria Old Age Home at Plamood, was organized on 24 November when the students of Grade XI and XII served lunch and engaged in activities with the inmates there. They celebrated Christmas with the

grandmothers of the old age home on 20 December, which offered a unique experience to the CNItes. They also donated blankets to all the inmates. Other activities such as a Beach clean-up, a toy collection drive and an animal shelter visit have also been mooted as part of the Initiative which would be carried out in the Third Term.

## Kids-Support - Kids

Various charitable activities were undertaken under the aegis of our charity organ. A sum of Rs. 1,00,000 was donated to Akshay of Christ Nagar English Higher Secondary School for his medical treatment. The non-teaching staff of CNIS paid a visit to an old age home in Vilapilshala, upon which an amount of Rs. 30,000 was further donated.

CNItes of grade V had a rare opportunity to visit an orphanage, St.Maria, run by the sisters of Missionaries of Charity, accommodating 24 children within the age group of 3 to 5 years. Christmas being a season of gifts, our students became role models by distributing used toys to these children who were delighted to receive the same along with a check of Rs 10,000/-. The students spent nearly two hours playing and enjoying with the inmates. It was a much cherished experience for our students as they realized how lucky and privileged they themselves were. A few of our students also promised to visit the orphanage personally with their family.



On 23 September 2016, students of Grades I to V were taken for a leisure trip to Happy Land Water Theme Park. CNItes of Grades VI, VII, VIII and IX visited the Thenmala Eco Tourism on 7 October 2016. The students of Grades X, XI & XII had a fun-filled three-day trip to Coorg and Wayanad on 19, 20 and 21 November, wherein they got revitalized to face their forthcoming Board Examinations with added vitality.
