CARNIVAL OF LITTLE WONDERS CHILDREN'S DAY

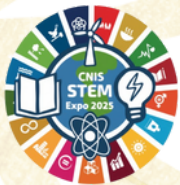

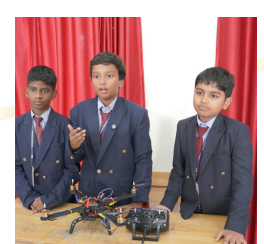
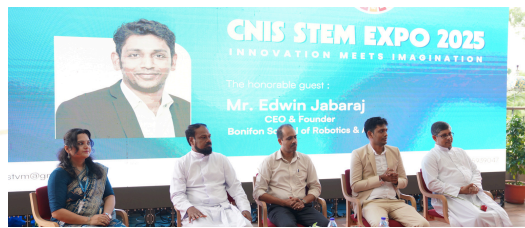
This year's Expo stood out as a milestone event as it was for the first time that the students showcased new AI models and applications.

Their emotional reactions to seeing lifelike images of their future selves created a powerful and inspiring moment. The morning also featured a series of student-led presentations, including a Pictoblocks project on facial expression detection by CNITe Advika S A of Grade 1-I and a research paper presentation on the role of artificial intelligence in medicine by CNITe Gautham V Krishna of Grade XI.
